El Elyon [The God Most High]

1. List the strengths of how you were raised as a child.
2. List the weaknesses you see in how your parents raised you.

MY SALTY PSALM

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David says, “**He is my shield** and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold. I call to the Lord, who is worthy of praise, and I am saved from my enemies” (Ps. 18:2-3).

“The Lord thundered from heaven; the voice of the Most High resounded. **He shot his arrows** and scattered the enemies . . . He reached down from on high and took hold of me; he drew me out of deep waters” (Ps. 18: 13-14, 16).

“He rescued me from my powerful enemy, from my foes, who were too strong for me” (17).

“He brought me out into a spacious place” (19).

“According to the cleanness of my hands he has rewarded me” (20).

“You, O Lord, keep my lamp burning; my God turns my darkness into light” (28).

“**He is a shield** for all who take refuge in him” (30).

“Who is the Rock except our God?” (31).

“It is God who arms me with strength and makes my way perfect” (32).

“He makes my feet like the feet of a deer; he enables me to stand on the heights” (33).

“**He trains my hands for battle**” (34).

“**You give me your shield of victory**, and your right hand sustains me” (35)

“You broaden the path beneath me” (36).

“I pursued my enemies . . . You made my enemies turn their backs in flight, and I destroyed my foes” (37, 40).
